

Two local students net scholarships

Two Box Elder County high school students recently were named recipients of EnergySolutions Foundation Scholarship Program.

Heather Haderlie from Box Elder High School and Owen Craven from Bear River High School each received a \$2,000 scholarship. They were selected from among those interested in earning a bachelor's degree in math, science or engineering.

"The long term goal of the program is to help create the next generation of mathemati-

cians, scientists, and engineers for America's future. This is an excellent opportunity for the Foundation to act locally and get results on a global scale," said Fraser Bullock, Chairman of the Foundation Board. "We recognize the need our nation has for a well trained workforce and this is a great vehicle to promote that," said Bullock.

The scholarship recipients will be honored at a banquet during April in Salt Lake City. The keynote speaker for the banquet will be Michael Ben-

son, President of Southern Utah University.

The scholarship program began in October 2006. The application period for 2008 applicants will be available starting in October 2007.

The EnergySolutions Foundation also grants money for environmental clean-up in Utah. The Foundation was established to fund projects dedicated to cleaning up and enhancing Utah's environment for the benefit of current and future generations.
