

## Local student nets top scholarship

Three Utah high school students will be able to worry a little less about paying for their college education. Heather Haderlie, a sophomore from Box Elder High School in Brigham City, is the top distinguished award scholarship recipient from the EnergySolutions Foundation.

Haderlie was selected from the 118 individual high school honorees to be awarded an additional \$25,000 merit-based scholarship to study math, science, or engineering in college.

The EnergySolutions Foundation began the scholarship program in 2006 as a way to promote the, study of math, science, and engineering in college to help foster the next generation of professionals in these disciplines. The scholarship was open to every high school in Utah with a \$2,000 award. All recipients were entered into a competition for three additional distinguished awards scholarship worth \$2,500, \$5,000 and \$25,000.

Haderlie is the daughter of Russell and Linda Brown of Brigham City and Scott and Wendi Haderlie of Willard.

She has had numerous leadership experiences including being a member of Student Government, Future Business Leaders of America historian and photographer, and will serve as a Spanish Club officer during her junior year. Haderlie received the "Hugh O'Brian Leadership Award" as "Outstanding Sophomore" from the Civic Improvement Club of Brigham City. With this award, she will be attending the Hugh O'Brian Leadership Camp in Aspen Grove in May.

Haderlie has been a member

of the Journalism Staff, High School Swimming and Tennis teams, and a member of National Junior Honor Society and National Honor Society.

She has a 4.0 G.P.A. and is ranked number one of 504 in her class. She has been involved in many acts of community service including a tutoring program for underprivileged Hispanic students. She has made and distributed quilts to nursing homes and women's shelters, helped with food drives for the Ogden Rescue Mission, and collected and distributed toys for sick children in the hospital in an annual Christmas Toy Drive.
